How to claim the Workforce Development Fund (WDF) Information for employers

The Workforce Development Fund (WDF) is a funding stream from the Department of Health distributed by Skills for Care. It focuses on the achievement of qualification units and supports the on-going professional development of staff across the adult social care sector within England. How to claim WDF

Decide on what you want to fund and which learning provider to use

Commission learning and development for your employees for any of the advertised units/qualifications eligible for funding.

Before agreeing to any contract with a learning provider ensure they will supply you with unit summary sheets, or equivalent, signed off by the internal verifier on completion of units as you will need this to claim the funding (see step 6). Check that you will not be charged for the supply of verified summary sheets.

Register on the National Minimum Data Set for Social Care (NMDS-SC)

You need your NMDS-SC number to join a partnership (see step 4).

5 Check that your NMDS-SC account complies with WDF

Update your NMDS-SC account(s) in line with the requirements for WDF as advertised.

You can run the 'My WDF NMDS-SC requirements report' or 'Parent WDF NMDS-SC requirements report' to confirm whether your account complies with the requirements for WDF.

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6 Claim for the completed units

Submit the unit summary sheets, or equivalent, signed off by the internal verifier to the partnership.

The partnership will submit units from the acceptable units list, signed off between the advertised dates, to Skills for Care to claim WDF on your behalf as long as steps 4 and 5 have been completed in full, (maximum of 60 credits per learner per funding year – April to March).

Receive payment from the partnership.

The partnership will pay you once they have received funding from Skills for Care.
